Invite health and human services focused nonprofits that provide essential, direct supports/services to those in need to review the grant FAQs and grant application guidance for the Initiative at iuw.org/capitalgrants.

2

Encourage nonprofits to complete the eligibility assessment.

3

If a nonprofit passes initial qualification, assess project alignment with grant guidelines and essential health and human services needs in your community. Does project advance critical needs? If in doubt, contact Indiana United Ways!

4

If project advances critical needs, contact Rachel Lee, Director of the Statewide Capital Projects Initiative at Indiana United Ways at rachel.lee@iuw.org to discuss project workplan and assess grant readiness.

5

In consultation with Rachel, determine whether the proposed project qualifies for Tier 1 or Tier 2 project application.

6

Participate in project meetings and support nonprofit partner in collecting materials required to complete application. Special funding *may* be available to contract support staff for a project. *Contact IUW to learn more*.

7

Endorse the project with IUW, then invite nonprofit to apply for Tier 1 or Tier 2 funding (see additional steps below).
